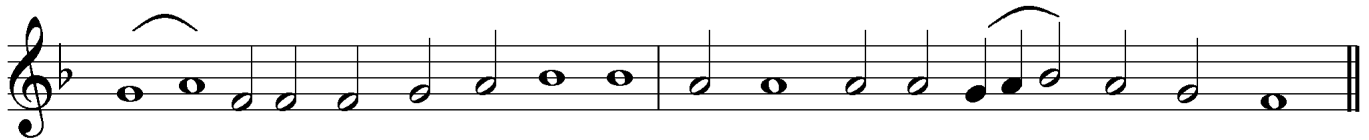


Beatitudes, Tone 1

(Greek Chant)

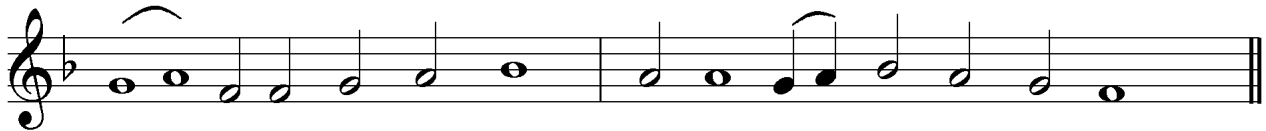


(I) In your king - dom re - mem - ber us, O Lord, when you come in your king - dom.

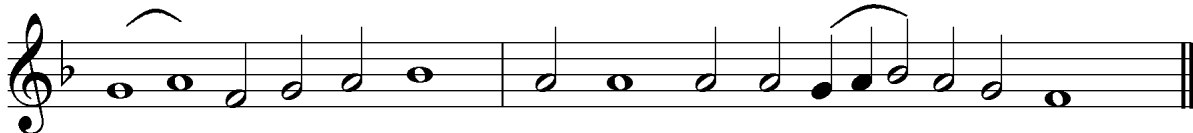


Bless - ed are the poor in spir - it, for theirs is the king - - dom of heaven.

(I) Bless - ed are the meek, for they shall in - her - - - it the earth.

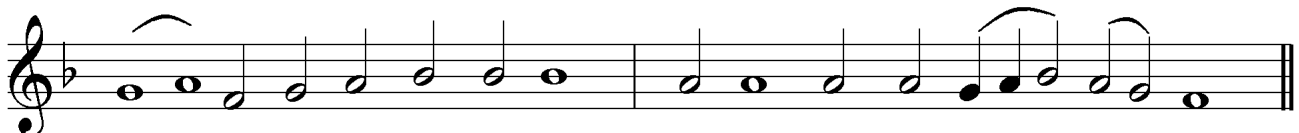

(8 verses begin here)

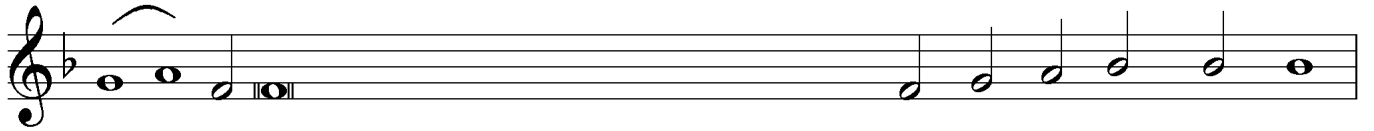


(II) Bless - ed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.



(I) Bless - ed are the peace - mak - ers, for they shall be called chil - dren of God.

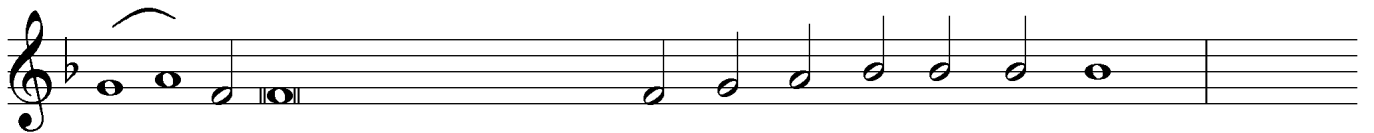

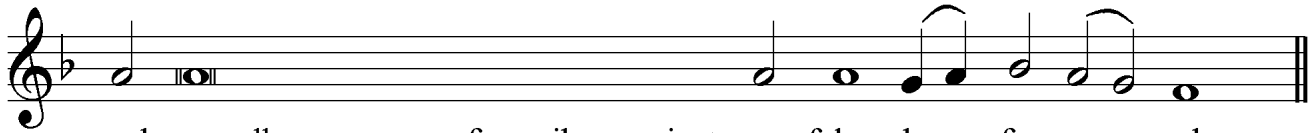
(II) Bless - ed are those who are per - se - cut - ed for the sake of right - eous - ness,



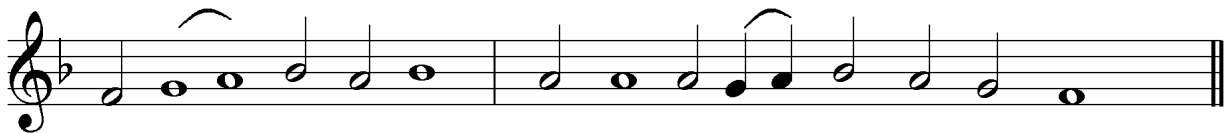
for theirs is the king - - dom of heaven.
